



THE BOOTLEGGER



ARRL Centennial Convention

The American Radio Relay League (ARRL) will be celebrating its 100th anniversary at its national convention on July 17-19, 2014 in Hartford, Connecticut. The event promises to be a one of a kind gathering of amateurs from all over the world! The ARRL for last one hundred years has been the definitive authority on Ham Radio. As we prepare to face the challenges of the next century the ARRL, its affiliated clubs, members from every state and nation will take a little time to say HAPPY BIRTHDAY!

How many of us expect to be stronger and more vibrant after 100 years, well the ARRL is! The proximity of this gathering to this area makes this an event not to be missed. The ARRL is still in the planning stage but the weekend will include forums, exhibits excursions to W1AW, a special events station, the "Centennial Banquet" and ARRL "Wouff Hong" Ceremony. I expect (well I'm guessing) that there will be some top DXers, technical innovators, public service, contesting, tower related topics and regulatory forums to name but a few! In short, the Centennial Convention promises to have something for every ham.

The ARRL has even created a new logo commemorating this moment.



The ARRL created this logo and the main element of the ARRL Centennial logo is the traditional ARRL diamond. You will also notice five diamonds in different colors. They represent Public Service, Advocacy, Education, Technology and Membership. These five "underpinnings" as the League describes them have kept the ARRL at the forefront in advancing the radio art.

Think about this for a second when Hiram Percy Maxim "The Old Man" first established the American Radio Relay League it was an attempt by him and other hams to organize relay stations in order to improve the efficiency of getting messages over long distances. Today the ARRL comments and protects the interests of hams who are interested in EME (Earth Moon Earth, bouncing signals off the surface of the moon) or as many know it....Moon Bounce! Talk about messages traveling long distances! On the Educational front many school children have had QSOs with Astronauts aboard the International Space Station using Amateur Radio. Is it possible one of those kids might be the next innovator and technical visionary of the twenty first century? Or perhaps they will be drawn into public service and ham radio will be that link.

The wildfires and weather events of the last two years have shown the need for coordination in the area of Public Service. It's here that members volunteer for public service events and aid in times of disaster. The ARRL Field Organization provides the training, coordination to get hams where they might do the most good. Hams <u>regardless</u> of whether they are ARRL members, train and devote their time and skills to aid communities in times of need. If there is a parade, a charitable event or lost child chances are that hams are somewhere and some how involved!

The Yonkers Amateur Radio Club has been an ARRL affiliated club of the ARRL since 1948 and that makes the club one of the longest affiliated ARRL clubs in the Hudson Division! A good showing by YARC members at Hartford next year would be fantastic! I have included links to the ARRL website that has information on the upcoming Centennial Convention at the end of this article.
